- Majors in the College of Business should take Introduction to Psychology + Introduction to Sociology. Education (c) majors are required to take American National Government while Introduction to Psychology is recommended. Education majors should see an advisor for other options.
- Several majors require Calculus. Check a Bradley catalog or a Bradley advisor. LIT 208 can be either NW or HL, but not both. (d)

Engineering and Education majors may require a general education course at the 300 level. Please consult a Bradley advisor.
